

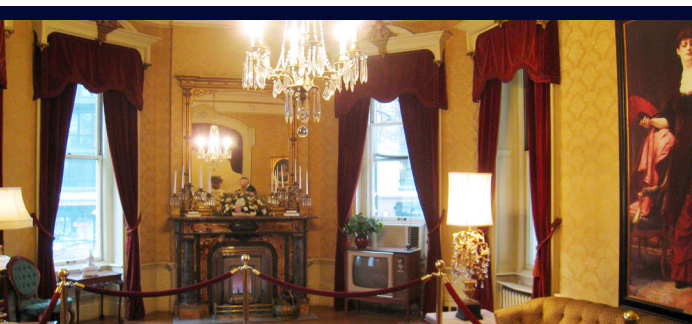


SUTTER'S FORT STATE HISTORIC PARK

In 1839 a Swiss immigrant named John Sutter received a land grant in the Sacramento Valley from the Mexican government. He used the land to create a flourishing agricultural empire and named it New Helvetia (New Switzerland). This empire established Sacramento's earliest settlement and the first non-Indian settlement in California's Central Valley. Sutter's Fort has served as a trading post, a rehabilitation point for Donner Party survivors and a refugee camp for people displaced by the 1906 earthquake in San Francisco. Sutter's Fort is located at 2701 L Street.

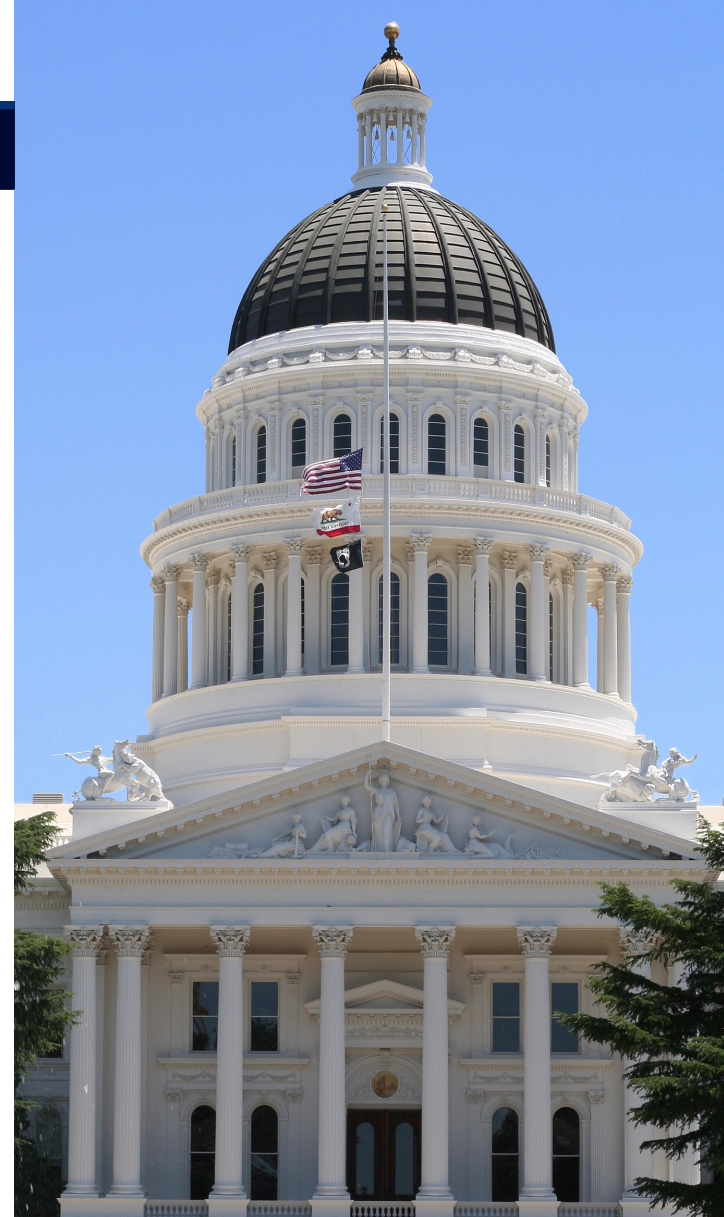
TOUR A MANSION OR TWO

The Leland Stanford Museum and the Governor's Mansion offer a wealth of history about the area. The Leland Stanford Mansion, the former home of the eighth governor of California (Leland Stanford), was built in 1856, was home to three governors in the 1860s. The Governor's Mansion, built in 1877, housed 13 governors. (Current Gov. Brown never lived there but visited when his father held the office.) The Leland Stanford Museum is located at 800 N Street. The Governor's Mansion is located at 16th and H Street.

PUBLIC ARTWORK

Sacramento is home to more than 600 pieces of art in front of city and county buildings stroll through Convention Center Sculpture Garden at the Sacramento Convention Center, located at 13th and K Streets.

THE CALIFORNIA MUSEUM

The California Museum, home of the California Hall of Fame, engages, educates and enlightens people about California's rich history, arts and culture. The Museum inspires men, women and children to pursue the California dream and make a mark on history. The museum is located at 1020 O Street.

RIVER WALK PARK

Meander along the west bank of the Sacramento River on a scenic trail beginning at the Tower Bridge. Along the trail are many educational signs describing the settlement of Sacramento as well as the natural habitat of the river. The park is located at 651 Second Street, West Sacramento.

OLD SACRAMENTO STATE HISTORIC PARK

Old Sacramento is a cluster of noteworthy, early Gold Rush commercial structures. Old Sacramento's historical significance comes from it being the western end point of the Pony Express postal system, the first transcontinental railroad, and the transcontinental telegraph. Enter Old Sacramento at 3rd and J Street or at Capitol Mall and Front Street.

CALIFORNIA STATE RAILROAD MUSEUM

The California State Railroad Museum in Old Sacramento is the world-class tribute to the role of the "iron horse" in connecting California to the rest of the nation. The museum features 21 restored locomotives and cars, and a full-scale diorama of a 1860s construction site high in the Sierra Nevada. The museum is located at 125 I Street.

BROWSE THE CROCKER ART MUSEUM

The Crocker Art Museum is the first public art museum founded in the Western United States, and is now one of the leading art museums in California. The Museum offers a diverse spectrum of Californian art, works on paper, European art, international ceramics, photography, Asian art, and African and Oceanic art. The museum is located at 216 O Street.

TOUR THE STATE CAPITOL & CAPITOL PARK

It's architecturally stunning, rich with history and free to the public. The California State Capitol Museum and the Capitol are one and the same, so as you are walking the halls, you are right in the heart of California's working seat of government. Take a stroll through Capitol Park, the grounds and gardens surrounding the California State Capitol building. It includes trees from around the world and features memorials to significant events involving California. The Capitol is located on 10th Street between L and N Streets.
